Dave Black: a tribute



It was with great sadness that we learned of the passing of club stalwart Dave Black on 24 May. Dave had been an active member of the club for many years. His energy and influence as our club Chairman between 2009 and

2014 led to major improvements in our offer to club members.

It was during Dave's Chairmanship that he experienced some misfortune, badly injuring his leg. However Dave's bad luck soon turned to the club's benefit, since enforced time on his hands for rest and recovery led to some serious thinking and planning. Very soon Dave had sourced significant investment in the club, by way of grants from Sport England and the Royal Yachting Association. This enabled the purchase of the Fanatic Viper beginners' boards and associated rigs that many members benefit from using, and a new rescue boat and engine to replace our ten aging Dory. Furthermore, the money paid for half a dozen members to be trained as RYA Start Windsurfing instructors, including first aid and powerboat training.

Dave's influence on the local windsurfing scene goes wider than Hickling. In his retirement he taught beginner windsurfers at Whitlingham Outdoor Education Centre, Norwich and I know many members took their first tentative steps on a board under Dave's careful and patient tutelage. For example, Glen Moore recalled, "Dave taught me at Whitlingham. He showed endless amounts of patience and a gentle sense of humour, which kept us motivated through the two days."



Of course there was much more to the Dave than Dave the windsurfer. He loved being in the open air, and travelling to committee meetings together he would always regale me with stories of his climbing exploits as a young man. As he matured, simply walking in the great outdoors became a passion, as well as keeping his allotment. And of course he was a deeply committed and devoted family man: our heartfelt sympathies go to Judith, his children and grandchildren.

As per Dave's wishes there will be a private committal ceremony and, in a few weeks, there will be a celebration of his life for family and close friends, with the date and venue to be decided.

In memory of Dave, his family has set up a Just Giving page for donations to the Outward Bound Trust. This is an educational charity that uses the outdoors to help develop young people, from all walks of life, to face the challenges at every stage of their education and transition into employment. Come and Try Day: 21 May 2017




